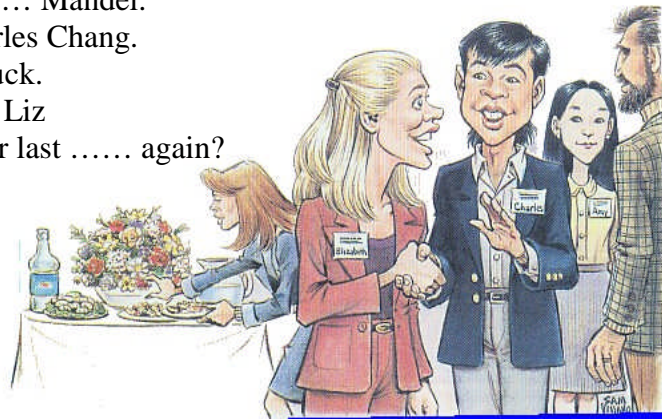

2. *Functional skills: Introductions*

It is usual for a third person to perform introductions in English.

We will say:

1. This is Mr Ahmad Syafii ... this is Ms Emisari (at the same time indicating each person with his hands).
How d'you do - How d'you do
or
2. May I introduce you to Mr Susilo? ... This is Mr.Haryadi
How d'you do - How d'you do
or Pleased to meet you - Pleased to meet you too.

Remember that **How d'you do** is only used after introductions, and it cannot be used for later meetings. **If there is no third person to introduce you, say:**

May I introduce myself? My name is Rahadi.

How d'you do? My name is Mariana.

Hi, I'm Lisa.

NOTE: Men do not call themselves Mr. They use either their Christian name and surname as above, or just their surname. Women normally use both Christian name and surname; they may add Mrs or Miss to avoid confusion.


If you are introducing a speaker you should say (indicating the speaker with your hand):

Ladies and gentlemen, Professor Howard

or

Ladies and gentlemen, I have great pleasure in introducing our guest speaker,
Dr. Wibisono. (*formal*)

Ladies and gentlemen Titi Dwi Jayanti. (*informal*)
